Who should apply?

- Those interested in obtaining a secondary (grades 5-12) teaching credential in the area of Biology, English Language Arts, Mathematics, History, or Social Studies with a Master in Teaching degree.

What are the deadlines?

- **Application deadline: September 15 annually for January (spring semester) enrollment**
- **Final transcript evaluations for September 15 application: contact Dan Overbay**
- **Program begins: January annually**

How is the program structured?

- The program begins annually in January (spring semester)
- The program involves a minimum of 40 semester hours of certification courses including a year-long field experience
- The Master in Teaching (MIT) degree requires a minimum of two additional courses beyond the certification coursework
- This program does NOT allow time for full-time employment. Students will need to be available during the week-day for field-based work and in the evenings for WSU classes.

Overview of Time Commitments

Semester	In Public School Classrooms	In WSU Courses
Spring	Day-time observations and/or research	Late afternoons and evening
Summer	None	During the day
Fall	Pre-Internship: 12 hours/week (minimum) during the school day	Late afternoons and evening
Spring	Student Teaching Internship: 5 days/week during the school day	Late afternoons and evenings

Am I ready to apply?

- Request transcript evaluation if you believe you have completed at least half of the required prerequisite courses (*WSU students **do not** need to submit transcript copies*)

- Send completed transcript evaluation form and unofficial transcripts to:

- Completed evaluations will be sent via e-mail. Evaluations may take four to six weeks

- The Department Application Portfolio will be sent to all candidates who have demonstrated they are or will be within 2 classes (6 semester credits) of completing the required coursework by the January program start date
- Complete and pass the WEST-B and NES/WEST-E content exam prior to the start of the program (see below)
- A cumulative 3.0 GPA, determined by the WSU Graduate School
- Some experience working with school age children (preferably in grades 5-12). For applicants with a 3.0 GPA or higher 30-60 hours is recommended, for those applicants with a GPA less than 3.0 70-100 hours is recommended in diverse educational environment.

Are there any tests I need to take? Testing websites: www.west.nesinc.com (WEST-B and NES/WEST-E)
*Yes. Testing will require two test dates so it is important to plan ahead. Official, passing **score reports must be received by December** prior to the program start; send test scores to WSU Pullman (school code 240). **All scores must be on file by December 1 of the year of application.***

- WEST-B/Basic skills exam or SAT/ACT—all sections (reading, writing, and mathematics) must be passed prior to admission to the program
- NES/WEST-E Content Area—measures the content knowledge required for the Washington secondary teaching certificate. A passing score of 220 for the NES or 240 for the WEST-E is required for admission

How do I apply?

- The Master in Teaching Secondary Application Portfolio is available from the Academic Coordinator upon satisfactory transcript evaluation of prior content area coursework. Contact Dan Overbay at dan.overbay@wsu.edu or 360.546.9673 for more information.
- Follow the two-step process listed in the application portfolio to apply to the Education Department and to the WSU Graduate School
